The FCCB library collection is now comprised not only of adult and children's books, but also audio fiction and non fiction, and video/DVD. In recent months the Great Courses collection has been growing (see information elsewhere). Check-outs work on the honor system and users are asked to sign for materials (legibly, please!) and leave a phone number if user is not in FCCB directory. Returned items may be left on the counter near the entrance.

Currently there are about 2200 books in the collection and 200 items in audiovisual. Updated catalogs have been printed by author and by title: these lists are in notebooks at the checkout station.
